ETERNAL PATROL



Richard Ware Plumbley Jr-Shipmate Richard Plumbley deployed on Eternal Patrol 25 December, 2023. Born in Santa Rita, New Mexico, Rick spent his childhood, along with his sister Hazel Eileen, between El Paso, TX and Ruidoso NM, where he spent his time at his Grandparents cabin, hunting and fishing. Rick attended Stephen F Austin High School where he was a stand out catcher and running back. He enlisted in the Navy in August 1965, and after basic training in San Diego he attended Yeoman "A" school and graduated first in his class. He spent three tours on Vietnam on the USS Tulare as a "Mike Boat" driver. Upon the suggestion of his CO, Rick enrolled in Submarine School, and upon graduation in 1968, was assigned to his qual boat, the USS Sablefish. He transferred to the Bang in 1968, and was honorably discharged in November 1969. Rick was awarded the Vietnam Service Medal (three stars), the Vietnam Campaign Medal, and the National Defense Medal. After the Navy, Rick moved back to San Diego, and enrolled in college and earned a certification in technical illustration. He worked as a commercial artist for years, ultimately ownibg his own commercial art studio with clients such as Travel Lodge, and local developers in San Diego County.

Andrew Sprainis— Shipmate "Andy" received his orders for eternal patrol on 11 January 2024. Born on August 5, 1951 in Cantonsville, Md he spent most of his life in Ellicott City and Mt. Airy, Md. A talented carpenter, Andy's pursuits were real estate investment and development. A skilled golfer, impressive boogie boarder, passionate Harley-Davidson biker, and skier, Andy was a spirited soul with a wicked sense of humor, and a belief that anything was possible.
